Join HCFVC's Free Estate Planning & Trust Workshops This October

Did you know, of the 270,379 properties in Ventura County, only 30,203 are currently held in a trust? This means nearly nine out of every ten properties are not protected.

The financial consequences of not having an estate plan can be significant. With the average Ventura County home value



approaching \$1,000,000, probate fees on an unprotected estate can range from \$35,000 to \$70,000. These unnecessary expenses can be avoided with proper planning.

To support Ventura County residents in addressing this need, Health Care Foundation for Ventura County now offers a quarterly Estate Planning & Trust Workshop Series. These complimentary workshops are designed to help Ventura

County employees and community members navigate the process of creating or updating their will and trust.

Every workshop features Mitchell Davis, Senior Assistant County Counsel for the County of Ventura (pictured), along with other respected legal professionals, who present the fundamentals of estate planning in a clear and approachable format. The response from past workshops has been outstanding! More than 125 participants attended in person, and 100% of feedback received has been positive. \$2 Million Gold Coast RISE Grant Expands Breast Health Services at Ventura County Medical Center

Health Care Foundation for Ventura County is pleased to announce that it has been awarded a \$2,034,969 Resilience, Innovation, Sustainability, and Equity (RISE) grant from Gold Coast Health Plan. This transformative investment will allow Ventura County Medical Center's Breast Health Center to enhance and expand services for patients across our community.



The funding will increase mammography capacity, improve biopsy services, and add diagnostic ultrasound capabilities. It will also introduce Al-assisted mammography technology to help detect cancer earlier and improve patient outcomes. In addition, a repurposed hospital space will soon become a modern, patient-centered Breast Health Center designed to provide comprehensive, compassionate care.

To improve access for patients, expanded evening hours are already available on Tuesdays and Thursdays, along with one Saturday each month. As we continue to observe Breast Cancer Awareness Month, it is a timely reminder that adults ages 40-74 are recommended to get regular mammograms. HCFVC is grateful to Gold Coast Health Plan for this extraordinary commitment to expanding access to lifesaving breast health services for patients throughout Ventura County.

HCFVC Strengthens Fall Prevention Efforts with Gait Belt Donation to the Ventura County Fire Department

In recognition of Fall Prevention Month this September, Health Care Foundation for Ventura County was pleased to donate more than 100 gait belts to the Ventura County Fire Department to support their efforts in keeping our community safe.



Firefighters are often the first to respond to

fall-related emergencies, where timely assistance can significantly reduce the risk of further injury. A gait belt is a sturdy waist strap that lets caregivers and first responders securely hold and assist a person while walking or during transfers. They play a vital role after a fall by enabling safe support, reducing the risk of additional injuries, and helping ensure stable, secure transfers. By equipping local fire crews with these essential tools, HCFVC is helping make every emergency response safer and more effective for those in need.

To commemorate this meaningful partnership, HCFVC CEO Amy Towner joined Ventura County Fire Department leadership and Ventura County Medical Center trauma department staff for a group photo celebrating the donation and highlighting this ongoing collaboration dedicated to community health and safety.

Another simple way to give is through payroll deduction. A donation of just \$1 or more per pay period can make a lasting impact. If all 11,000 Ventura County employees participated, the collective generosity would significantly strengthen care for patients and families served by Ventura County Health Care Agency.
