Health Care Foundation for Ventura County Named an Action for Women's Health Awardee

In November, Health Care Foundation for Ventura County (HCFVC) was selected as **one of more than 80 organizations awarded funding through Action for Women's Health, a \$250 million global open call funded by Pivotal**. Launched in 2024, this open call supports organizations working to advance women's mental and physical health around the world. Founded by Melinda French Gates in 2015, Pivotal works to advance social progress and expand women's power and influence in the U.S. and around the world.



HCFVC was awarded between \$1 million and \$5 million in support of Ventura County Medical Center (VCMC) and Ventura County Health Care Agency

(VCHCA). The Foundation is honored to help steward this transformative investment for Ventura County's safety-net health and hospital system.

HCFVC was **selected from a pool of more than 4,000 applicants representing 119 countries**, each offering solutions to improve women's health across all stages of life. After a rigorous peer and expert review process, just over 80 organizations were chosen, many of which have historically lacked access to major philanthropic funding.

"This investment supports coordinated care across Ventura County Medical Center (VCMC), Santa Paula Hospital, and affiliated clinics," said John Fankhauser, MD, Chief Executive Officer of VCMC and Santa Paula Hospital. "By integrating language access, navigation, and prevention, we intend to improve patient experience and support earlier engagement in care."

"Our goal is to make care for women easier to navigate throughout Ventura County, offering support in the language they prefer and in settings that meet them where they are," said Amy Towner, Co-Founder and CEO of HCFVC.

HCFVC thanks Action for Women's Health, funded by Pivotal, for this impactful award in support of VCMC and VCHCA. This investment strengthens our shared efforts to expand access to high-quality care and essential resources for women across Ventura County.
